She was America's first African-American poet and one of the first women to be published in colonial America. She was also the first slave in the U.S. to have a book of poetry published.

One of America's early literary giants, was an enslaved woman from Massachusetts, Phillis Wheatley. Phillis Wheatley - Slave Poet of Colonial America Phillis Wheatley was born in Africa (probably Senegal) about 1753 or 1754. When she was about eight years old, she was kidnapped and brought to Boston. There, in 1761, John Wheatley bought her for his wife, Susanna, as a personal servant.
